SLOVAK STUFFED PEPPERS

INGREDIENTS (Peppers)

- 1 Cup Short Grain Rice
- 17.5 oz. Ground Pork
- 1 Small Onion, Diced
- 2 Garlic Cloves
- 1 Teaspoon Salt
- 1/2 Teaspoon Ground Black Pepper
- 1 Teaspoon Marjoram
- 1 Egg
- 8 Banana Peppers

INGREDIENTS (Tomato Sauce)

- 2 Tablespoons Lard/Oil
- 4 Tablespoons Flour
- 2 Cups Tomato Puree
- 1 Bay Leaf
- 1 Teaspoon Salt
- 2 Teaspoons Vegeta (Slovak Spice)

INSTRUCTIONS

- Cook short grain rice according to instructions. Rinse. Add 1 1/4 cup water and bring to a simmer over a medium flame for 25 minutes. Let the rice cool.
- Mix ground pork, diced onion, garlic, salt, pepper, marjoram, and egg. Combine mixture with rice.
- Stuff the meat mixture into the banana peppers.
- Prepare the tomato sauce by putting lard/oil into a pot on low-heat. When melted, sprinkle in flour and stir until golden. Add tomato puree, salt, bay leaf, and vegeta.
- Lay the stuffed peppers into tomato sauce. Add water so the sauce covers the peppers. Bring to a simmer for 40 minutes until the skin of the peppers wrinkle.
- Serve stuffed peppers with tomato sauce poured over top.

"Over many family dinners throughout the years, I would often hear about [my family's] involvement [with Marietta Community Foundation]," said Ryan. "It was something that I found impressive and was also encouraged of me. I'm just glad I've been able to actually follow in the footsteps they have been taking for many years."

Doug is now enjoying retirement and watching his grandchildren run around.

Ryan and his wife Katarina are hopeful their children, Mishka and Lukas, will one day not only cook Katarina's favorite family recipe, but also give back through Marietta Community Foundation.

As parents, artists, teachers, small-business owners and avid community-supporters, Bobby and Sara Rosenstock realize that you get out of life what you put into it.

When you enter into their shop, Just A Jar Design Press, you're immediately greeted by walls covered in posters that Bobby has produced. Many of these masterpieces were created for local initiatives, such as concerts, festivals, farmers markets, and more.

Their support of our community and its art scene is evident, but something that many don't

know is that they also choose to give back to the community as a whole by contributing annually to Marietta Community Foundation.

Giving through the Foundation gives them peace of mind, knowing that their funds are benefitting the projects/organizations in our area that have the greatest amount of need.

"As a donor, you know [your donation] is going to a place you can trust," said Bobby. "They're really good stewards of whatever funds they have, so it's like even if you only have a small amount to donate, you know that they can

combine that with other things and make a bigger impact." Sara added.

Sara also expressed that "it feels good knowing that an organization is putting their ear to the ground and knows what those needs are and then creates funds that are out of necessity."

The couple has witnessed the impact that the Foundation has on the community and their business' well-being.

"I think that a healthy and strong community kind of helps everyone," said Bobby.

Bobby also recognized that the Foundation has made a mark on their personal and professional lives through funding art projects as well as two organizations where their kids attend daycare.

Sara noted that working with the Foundation is similar to reaching out to your friends or family when you need support. For example, when an individual is in need, typically they’ll reach out to their friends or family. When a local nonprofit is in need, they can reach out to the Foundation

and know that they’re going to be cared about and helped if at all possible.

“I think it’s always good when people realize that other people care. Organizations, or businesses or government, it’s not always clear that people care about you.”

Sara is correct; Marietta Community Foundation is much more than a charitable giving partner — it’s a shared belief in a better tomorrow.

SPINACH PASTA

INGREDIENTS

- 2 3/4 Cups All-Purpose Flour
- 3 Eggs
- 1 Cup Cooked & Pureed Spinach
- 1/2 Teaspoon Salt

INSTRUCTIONS

- Mix flour, eggs, and salt in a large bowl.
- Add spinach puree and mix until a ball forms.
- Knead the dough for about 5 minutes.
- Cover the bowl with a towel and let the dough rest for 30 minutes.
- Cut dough into 4 equal portions.
- Using a pasta roller, flatten to level 4 thinness.
- Cut with fettuccine attachment.
- Repeat with remaining dough.
- Cook pasta in boiling water and enjoy.
- Serve plain with olive oil & Parmesan (Elle & Bayla’s choice)
- Serve with sautéed zucchini & shrimp (Bobby & Sara’s choice)

BAKED EGGPLANT SANDWICHES

INGREDIENTS

- 2 Small Eggplants, Sliced into 1/2” Rounds
- Salt and Pepper
- 2 Tablespoons Fresh Parsley, Chopped
- 1 Cup Breadcrumbs
- 1/4 Cup Grated Parmesan Cheese
- 1/2 Pound Provolone or Mozzarella Cheese, Thinly Sliced
- 1 Cup White Flour
- 3 Eggs, Beaten

INSTRUCTIONS

- Place eggplant slices on paper towels, lightly salt and let rest at least 20 minutes. Preheat oven to 350°. Spray a baking sheet with Pam.
- Mix together breadcrumbs, Parmesan cheese, parsley, salt and pepper.
- Place a slice of cheese between two eggplant rounds. Hold together firmly and coat both sides with flour. Dip sandwich into beaten eggs and then into breadcrumb mixture to coat both sides. Place on oiled baking sheet.
- Bake for 35-40 minutes or until easily pierced with a fork.
- Serve hot or at room temperature.
- Optional: serve with marinara sauce for dipping.

GREATER MARIETTA COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

For many members of our community, livelihood can be found nestled among a span of commercial properties.

What started as three young mothers in a Bible study group collecting canned goods following a devastating flood has grown into a 42-year-long-and-counting mission to serve our neighbors in need.

Each year, the Greater Marietta Community Food Pantry serves nearly 3,000 families suffering from food insecurity with dignity and compassion — and they don't intend to slow down.

Two years ago, the pantry moved to a new location that more than doubled their square footage. This allowed them to make great strides, but now they have developed a plan to further their mission.

“One of the possibilities that we’re working on is acquiring a van that would serve as a mobile pantry for the homeless,” said Sherry Hill, Director.

The pantry receives donations and funding from many partners, including Marietta Community Foundation.

INSTRUCTIONS

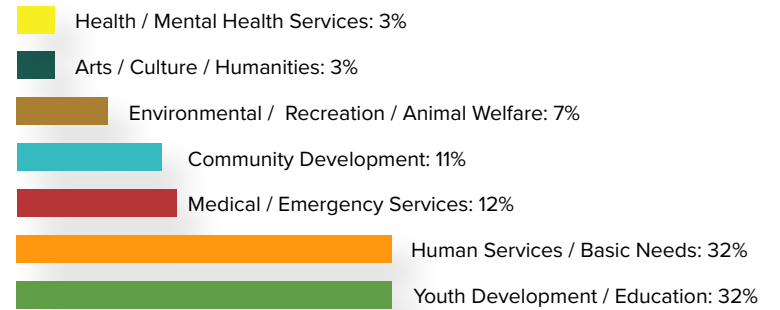
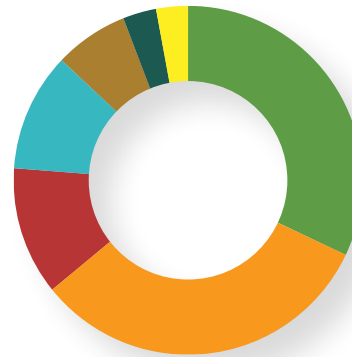
- Preheat oven to 375°. Evenly spread brown rice on the bottom of a 9x13 baking dish. Place chicken on top.

- Bake 45 minutes. At the end of cooking, add mixed vegetables and bake 5 more minutes until warmed through.



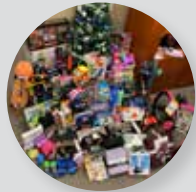

Since January 2011, every Wednesday morning a team of faithful volunteers take over the kitchen at the Knights of Columbus Hall on the west side of Marietta.

Daily Bread Kitchen provides nutritious meals to approximately 200 people each week. These meals are free of charge, and can be claimed by anyone in the community with no questions asked.

The organization is a ministry of The Basilica of Saint Mary of the Assumption, and is operated by six teams of volunteers who take turns serving each six weeks.

SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE

- Bake uncovered at 350° for 45 minutes or until set.
